H T Prinsep in Tibet, Tartary and Mongolia, writes

“The general expectation of the birth of a great prophet, Redeemer, or Saviour, which is alluded to even by Tacitus, as prevailing at the period when the founder of the Christian religion appeared, was, there can be no doubt, of Buddhist origin, and not all confined to the Jews, or based only on the prophecies of their scriptures.”

In Buddhism, Sir Williams quotes the Pali Canon as

stating that the 6th (generation) disciple of Buddha would be called “Yasa”, a shortened form of “Yasu”, or Jesus.

There is abundant evidence to suggest that the peoples of

Afghanistan and of Kashmir are Jewish in origin. It appears that the sons of Cush of the tribe of Judah travelled to Kashmir at the time of the Diaspora from Babylon, in 598 BC and onwards.

In addition, the Buddha, Sakya Mouni, was born around 563 BC in Kashmir. He was the first monotheistic prophet in a polytheistic land, and prophesied the appearance of the World Saviour, Avalokiteshwar, Maitreya, in 500 years from himself. He taught of heaven, hell, angels and a day of judgment. *Historical evidence clearly suggests that the Buddha was a messianic prophet of Jewish origin.*

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
