



Astrology In The Life of The Israelite: *A Brief Discussion of Moshe and His Coming to Knowledge.*

Allow me to cut straight to the chase. I think that I am living in Egypt.

Spiritually, physically, emotionally, psychologically; I am aware of the utter sense of bondage. I'm well fed, and, by far, richer than the majority of the planet's population. Just like my ancestors, I have fleshpots to the full. Yet, I still feel the enslavement in my everyday existence. Taxes, laws, tax-laws, rules regulations, restrictions. Has anyone ever considered this: we have thousands of people employed by the government whose sole purpose is to make new laws and regulations. Federal, state and local governments are churning out policies on a daily basis. Every area of our lives is regulated.



The discussion itself is so old, and has been covered by so many people, that I'm going to avoid the redundancy of retelling it. However, look at the history (biblical and other) of Egypt and tell me that the similarities found between the ancient land and the United States of America are not frighteningly beyond coincidental. Throw in all of the obelisks, slave labor and city names (Memphis, etc.) to boot. These very facts and similarities are what I find so interesting about the account of Moses.



He is a member of the persecuted slave-people that was raised and educated in the house of the oppressor. At a later time, evidently still cognizant of his ancestry, he makes an unsuccessful attempt to reconnect with his brothers and sisters that forces him to flee the land for a period of decades. He eventually returns and becomes the liberator of the Israelites, reuniting them with the spiritual heritage and 'god' of their ancestors. If understood in its proper context, the Torah is nothing more than a re-education document for freed slaves.

The Torah says, "don't work on the 7th day," because we were forced to work any **and** everyday. The Torah says, "don't have sex with animals," because we, in our debilitated state, did just that. The Torah tells us that, "there's only one 'god,'" because we got lost in the confusion of the surrounding culture's polytheism. The Torah says, "don't just randomly kill," because we were reduced to that savage behavior by centuries of slavery. "The Torah says, "don't eat shrimp," because we forgot the concept of 'clean' foods and didn't know what that black stripe down the shrimp's back was. We forgot that pigs don't sweat.

Imagine the life that was lead by those people before and after walking out into the desert. Imagine it or look around you. On television, on YouTube, in the stores, in the streets, at home. We still do the same slave-minded things. The line between back then and right now is not very distinct at all. Honestly, I think that we're living it all over again. Anyway, what does this have to with Moses and astrology?

Moses was raised in Pharaoh's house as an Egyptian: The food, the culture, the education, the religion. For all intents and purposes, Moses **was** an Egyptian. Consider some of these little tidbits:

No one really knows for sure what the name Moses means. "Drawn out, provided by, etc." That's because it's a slave name and, likely, not even Hebrew. After centuries in captivity, why would we assume that the Hebrew language would escape unscathed? Everything is diminished in captivity. It is very likely that Moses is only half or part of his name at best, a new 'liberated' name at the very least.

Some modern scholars had suggested that the daughter of the Pharaoh might have derived his name from the Egyptian name element mose, which means "son" or "formed of" or "has provided"; for example, "Thutmose" means "son of Thoth", and Rameses means "Ra has provided (a son)"¹



-moses There is a strong possibility that "Moses" might be a "chopped" name that loosed his association with some Egyptian deity. (From personal experience, seeing this information hit me close to home. My birth name is "Aaron," his brother. Real world etymology reveals that no one knows what Aaron means. It's not really Hebrew and assumed to be Egyptian with no strong correlate. The best guess is "lofty, mountaineer, teacher" and so forth. It might have its roots in the word "aram." Hence, its associations.) Moses and Aaron are so popular in our history and culture, but rarely do we stop and consider that these were **slave people to the bone**. Even their names were mangled in slavery and its aftermath. Look at all of us today with all of these scatter-shot names (Smiths, Johnsons, Bakers...) that won't tell our stories if someone hears or sees them. With names like that, even our identities are in captivity to anyone who comes after us. *That being said, why do people make*

fun of us when we change our names? Why are so many of us attached to our old name or ashamed to take on a new one?

The main point under consideration is that Moses was drowning in his oppression irrespective of his high-society upbringing. I dare say that, in some respects, he had it worse than some of his brothers and sister still hustling in the brick factories. They had the privilege of knowing that they were 'niggers' and less than the Egyptians. Their salvation is just a matter of walking away from a burning building, a system that already, and openly, disregards their value and worth. Moses has the education, the money, the ease. He came from the 'negro elitist,' 'talented tenth' class. They like the master because they benefit from the oppressors benevolence. That's a tough chain to break.

Truth be told, Moses isn't even the originator of monotheism like certain people would like for you to believe. He could have learned about it from Akhenaten. This pharaoh had his own history of struggle against the prevailing religious system of his day. Those who came after him made a conscious attempt to erase his memory and effect of his beliefs from the mass Egyptian consciousness. What if he learned of monotheism from his father-in-law? He was, also, a priest and gave him excellent advice, post-exodus, on administering justice to the people without wearying himself and others. Even prior to that, however, the book of Jasher/Yashar is a monotheistic document that goes back to Adam. How can Moses be the first when the 5 "books of Moses" give accounts of the monotheists before him?

Why, then, should we pay attention to anything that we hear about him? Because Moses found a way out of the trap.



Promoters of Kemet and Egyptology like to point out the similarities between various Kemetic beliefs and practices and the Israelite faith and culture as proof of Egyptian primacy. This sounds so true if you forget that Egypt was an oppressor and supplanter of various cultures and truths throughout its existence. History is written by the victor and there is a slim chance that the full story, one inclusive of the captive's perspective, will ever be told.

That being said, of course there are similarities. Look no further than the history of India/Bharat to see examples of this truth. Coincidentally, Dr. Muata Ashby discusses the culture similarities between Egypt and India in his book, *"Egypt and India: The African Origins of Yoga, Hinduism, Vedanta, Buddhism and Dharma of India."* In my opinion, what is not discussed is the fact that the Buddha made an attempt to break out of the sickness of his surrounding culture and religion. After growing up privileged, like Moses, he realized the futility of that type of existence and made an attempt to get out of the trap.

Egyptology, just like its sister system: Sanatana Dharma or Hinduism, is a rigid and complex system of

knowledge that controls all aspects of an individual's existence from cradle to grave. Most people don't know that the caste system of Hinduism is 'color-coded.' Take a guess at who's on top and who's on the bottom. Exactly! I'm not even going to say it here. Dr. Ashby tells us to our faces that India and Egypt are deeply related and he's a confessed Kemeticist.

Even the transmission of, supposedly, life-changing truth is rigidly controlled through 'mystery schools' and guru lineage. The Buddha left it, Moses left it, the prophets of Israel left it, Yahshua left it, Ravidas left it, Tulsidas left it, Rastafarians of Jamaica left it. Oppressed people leave it for a reason!



Permit me to rant a little more. It is documented by 'Hindus' that **Krishna lived and died in India.** He was accidentally shot with an arrow in similar fashion to the fate of Cain in the book of Jasher/Yashar. Shiva, of Indian lore, has his origins in the African/Dravidian people of Southern India. Shiva was a black, dreadlocked, herb-smoking man of antiquity. Incidentally, Shiva isn't white-skinned, he's covered with ash.

How did they become deified? The same way that individuals of Catholicism achieve sainthood. This system of corruption has not stopped since Babel and Nimrod. Modern Egyptologists admit this undeniable connection between these 2 cultures and civi-LIE-zations.

I have not caused anyone's suffering . . .

I have not copulated (illicitly); I have not been unchaste.

I have not increased nor diminished the measure, I have not diminished the palm; I have not encroached upon the fields.²

Buddhism and The Yoga Sutras of Patanjali have extremely similar lists or moral codes as stated above. Are

we to believe that one has copied from another or is it possible that there are and have always been basic truths that are indigenous to a safe and healthy existence on the planet?

Naturally, if Moses was highly educated in ALL Egyptian knowledge, the revelation of Yahowah Alaha at the burning bush would give him insight and discernment as to what information from his training as an Egyptian adept was true and accurate. If the only thing that he promoted was Egyptian theology and learning, why persecute him? The answer is as close as the modern-day struggle that we find ourselves in.
